



STILL CREEK RANCH

"Still Creek Ranch's mission is to rescue at-risk children and take them from crisis to new creation. We seek to have a multi-generational impact by breaking the cycle of crisis and empowering them to make Biblical decisions, have healthy relationships, and reach their full God-given potential."

Since 1988 Still Creek has rescued boys and girls from crisis environments including abuse, neglect, abandonment, and sexual exploitation... placing them in safe, loving, Christ-centered homes. Still Creek does not take any government funding but instead they operate exclusively through donations and are completely debt-free. This allows them the freedom to use Christ-centered principles in the care and healing of children.

Their mission is to rescue boys and girls from crisis environments and to restore their lives by placing them in one of their six family-style home environments. Through their accredited boarding school, Bible-based counseling, TCAL athletics, fine arts, equestrian, and agricultural programs, the children begin to believe in themselves and learn to trust.

Instead of extending pity toward the children for their devastating past, they create an environment for them to be empowered by their story, yet without allowing them to be defined by their past wounds. This is done by establishing a model of healing from the inside out; challenging the child to peel back the layers of hurt inside their heart by creating an opportunity to break the chains of their past and usher in authentic healing and restoration for their future.

EDUCATION

Still Creek Christian Academy is an onsite 4-12 school. Accredited through Cognia (formerly AdvancED), they are dedicated to advancing a Christ-centered worldview that puts trust in God as the firm foundation for a meaningful and fulfilling life.

Knowing that students come from crisis, the faculty and staff partner with house parents, counselors, and community members, to come along side the Holy Spirit in bringing healing to the children's wounds. They supplant lies with the Truth and love to kids through the messy and often frustrating ups and downs of working through past trauma.

Ultimately, Still Creek invites students to become ministers of the gospel as well. It is not enough for our students to simply survive crisis...they are intentionally encouraged, equipped, and empowered to overcome their trauma and become leaders and fellow-workers with Still Creek staff as they labor to bring all things back into a right relationship with God the Creator.

THE STUDENT EXPERIENCE

The 200 acres of Still Creek Ranch are divided between two campuses. The main campus is where you will find Still Creek Christian Academy, the covered equestrian center, administrative offices, staff housing, as well as the three boys' homes. The girls share three homes on the second campus which is gated, secure, and in an undisclosed location.

The homes are built with a family-friendly atmosphere in mind. Sill Creek's desire is for the students to experience a true family, including all of the joys and challenges that come along with families. Each house is home to up to eight children who are loved and cared for by on-site "House Parents" who live in private family quarters within the house.

Still Creek is very strategic and intentional with the children they rescue and care for. Still Creek does not take "troubled" children, but rescue children out of true crisis situations. These crisis scenarios include, but are not limited to: homelessness, abandonment by legal guardians, severe abuse, severe neglect, and sexual exploitation. Still Creek rescues both boys and girls between the ages of 10 and 14, who will stay at Still Creek through their high-school graduation. We do not accept applications for children over 14 years of age. Still Creek offers a college scholarship and apartment-style living to Still Creek graduates who choose to stay in the Bryan/College Station area for their college studies.

STILL CREEK EQUESTRIAN PROGRAM

Everything they do at Still Creek Ranch revolves around developing a child's education mentally, physically, emotionally, and spiritually. They help them find their calling and empower them to serve and seek opportunities within that calling by developing life skills to interact with society in a healthy and God honoring manner. Those who have spent time with horses know just how much they speak to the soul. They are but one of the many tools God uses at Still Creek to create functional and thriving men and women through Christ. These children get the awesome privilege of riding horses as a part of their school curriculum and a bit of horse therapy. Residents don't just learn to ride horses, they learn the horsemanship skills of caring for their horse.

TRANSITIONAL LIVING PROGRAM (TLP)

Residents who have graduated from Still Creek Christian Academy (SCCA) and wish to continue to have their support system as they transition to college, trade school, or going into the workforce, are invited to be a part of the Transitional Living Program (TLP). TLP offers SCCA graduates a transitional living in three stages.

Stage 1: First semester of college or through the calendar year if entering trade school or the workforce. Young adults at Still Creek will live in the same home they grew up in, now as the big brother or big sister in the boys' or girls' homes respectively.

Stage 2: The next three semesters, or roughly one and a half years. The young adults in the TLP will live on Still Creek Ranch independently in apartment/cabin-style living as they go to school and/or work.

Stage 3: Two years after high school graduation. The student will either transfer to university level enrollment, enter the workforce, or begin to exit the TLP, if they are successfully employed and ready for independent living. Undergraduates will remain in the TLP and begin to live in Still Creek sponsored housing away from the ranch. This represents the last "phase" of the TLP as Still Creek helps their resident young adults to true independence, residentially, and financially.

DEPT OF FAMILY & PROTECTIVE SERVICES

The Texas Department of Family & Protective Services works with communities to protect children, the elderly, and people with disabilities from abuse, neglect, and exploitation through investigations, services/referrals, regulations, and prevention programs. You can help your family or DFPS's mission through programs such as:

Family-Based Safety Services (FBSS) can help avoid the need to remove children from their homes—or make it possible for the children to return home—by strengthening the ability of families to protect their children and reduce threats to their safety. CPS uses in-home ser-

vices to help families maintain a stable and safe home and to reduce the risk of future abuse or neglect. FBSS services include family counseling, crisis intervention, parenting classes, substance abuse treatment, domestic violence intervention, and day care.

Family Group Decision Making (FGDM) has a variety of practices to work with and engage children, youth, and families in safety and service planning and decision making.

Parent Collaboration Group (PCG) provides a way to include birth parents in our ongoing efforts to review and improve CPS. As clients, they bring a unique and valuable perspective on how to improve services to families and children. Local DFPS staff partner with parent liaisons to enhance services and communication between the agency and families getting CPS services.

Responsible Fathering Fathers are a critical component of the family, and a father's involvement in the lives of his children can be essential to their success as they deal with life from day to day. The goal of Responsible Fathering is to provide men and their families with support and services to help them be fully involved dads.
